Morgan has worked at NFHA for over 13 years, formerly serving as General Counsel and Director of Enforcement and Investigations.

Previously, Morgan was General Counsel of the Greater New Orleans Fair Housing Action Center, managing fair housing enforcement in post-Katrina New Orleans and throughout Louisiana and southern Mississippi. Morgan graduated with a B.A. at Oberlin College and a J.D. magna cum laude from Tulane Law School. He has serve
